## Quick Daily/Weekly Topic

### **WARNING SIGNS**

We (all of us... functional leaders, plant leaders, plant employees) have to pay attention to **WARNING SIGNS** when they occur.

Examples of warning signs that each of us has experienced:

- *lunchroom/hallway/control room discussions about unsafe situations*
- *situations that just don't "look right/feel right" as we walk through our plants*
- *strange noises/odors from our process areas an increase in active process alarms when the plant appears to be operating normally*
- *Visual smoke from a distance*
- *A possible steam leak that surfaces and makes noise in your work area while you are working*
- *A disgruntled individual acting out of his/her normal demeanor*
- *An individual that blurts out "do not worry about safety procedures I conducted this task 1000 times and nothing went wrong"*
- *If your H2S monitor alarm sounds*
- *If there is a "do not operate" tag on machine*
- *All danger and caution tags*
- *If a sign indicates "wet paint" guess what the paint is wet – DO NOT TOUCH!*
- *Operations personnel only*
- *High voltage*
- *Warning lights*
- *And last but not least **"DANGER DONOT ENTER"***

***Pay attention to the warning signs. STOP, QUESTION and CONVINCED YOURSELF that all is well before proceeding on with your day. Escalate unsafe conditions or behaviors when necessary.***
